#### THE NORTHWEST ATLANTIC FISHERIES

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Status of the American plaice fishery in Subarea 2-Division 3K,

Division 3M and Subdivision 3Ps<sup>1</sup>

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The principal fishery for American plaice in the Convention Area occurs on the Grand Bank, ICNAF Divisions 3L, 3N and 30. The stock here was placed under quota starting in 1973. Other stocks of plaice in Subareas 2 and 3 are also being exploited and it is the purpose of this document to present a brief summary of the status of the fishery in Subarea 2 and 3K, Division 3M and Division 3Ps.

# American Plaice Subarea 2 and Division 3K

From knowledge of the extent of plaice migrations in Division 3L and 3N it is quite probable that very little mixing occurs between adult plaice in Division 3K and those to the south in Divisions 3L, N, O, although Division 3K may be a source of recruitment to Division 3L at the egg and larval stages. The Canadian fishery for American plaice in Subarea 2 and 3K is conducted almost entirely by inshore boats 50 tons and under using gill nets (165-203 mm) almost exclusively. The fishery is in conjunction with the cod, witch and Greenland halibut fishery. However, as with the latter fishery the boats have been forced to move farther offshore because of dwindling stocks. Research cruises to the area do not indicate particularly large concentrations but rather a number of relatively small aggregates scattered throughout the area possibly depending on the correct conditions such as suitable bottom sediment.

With a limited knowledge of the availability of plaice in these divisions a TAC of about 8000 tons (the average for the past 5 years) (Table 1) is suggested with about 1500 tons subtracted for removals outside the Convention Area.

# American Plaice - Division 3M (Flemish Cap)

This stock is distinct from the Grand Bank stock as indicated by vertebral averages (Pitt, 1963), age at sexual maturity (Pitt, 1964) and rate of growth (Pitt, 1967). The total stock on Flemish Cap is probably relatively small and the only substantial landings reported were in 1965 and 1966 by the USSR which listed about 5000 and 4000 tons respectively (Table 2) of "unspecified flounder." Presumably these were all plaice and were probably by-catches of the cod fishery. Judging from recent catches it appears highly unlikely that the TAC should exceed 2000 tons annually.

## American Plaice Division 3Ps (St. Pierre Bank-Newfoundland South Coast)

The separation of 3Ps plaice from Grand Bank stock (Divisions 3L, 3N and 30) is primarily based on its geographic separation from the latter area and also because no plaice tagged on the Grand Bank were recovered on St. Pierre Bank or in adjacent localities. Except for relatively large catches taken in 1968 (8350 tons) and 1969 (4340 tons) by the USSR the fishery has been mainly by Canada with small

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quantities landed annually by the St. Pierre based French fishery (Table 3). No real knowledge of the condition of the stock is at present available but a TAC of between 8000 and 9000 tons is suggested here with 2500-3000 tons from outside the Convention Area.
